The evaluation form was filled in by 11 people, representing 7 CIDREE members. The results were overwhelmingly positive. On person expressed a negative view of the content of the conference and one other participant was negative about the added value for his/her institution and for his/her own understanding of Assessment for Learning. Particularly appreciated was the degree to which delegates could contribute, the communication preceding the conference, the added value for CIDREE and the degree to which delegates were planning to follow the conference up within their institution.

Apart from the CIDREE representatives the conference was attended and contributed to by some 25 Slovenians, employed by the host institution, ZRSS or people teaching in Slovenian schools. There were also a couple of participants from Bosnia – Herzegovina. In this way the conference did not only address a representative CIDREE audience, but also involved an important dissemination effort towards third parties.

The preparation and organization of the conference were exemplary, thanks to the efforts of Brigita Zarkovic – Adlesic and Alan Armstrong, and the outstanding logistic support by ZRSS.

The conference seems to be an excellent start for a CIDREE project on Assessment for Learning.
